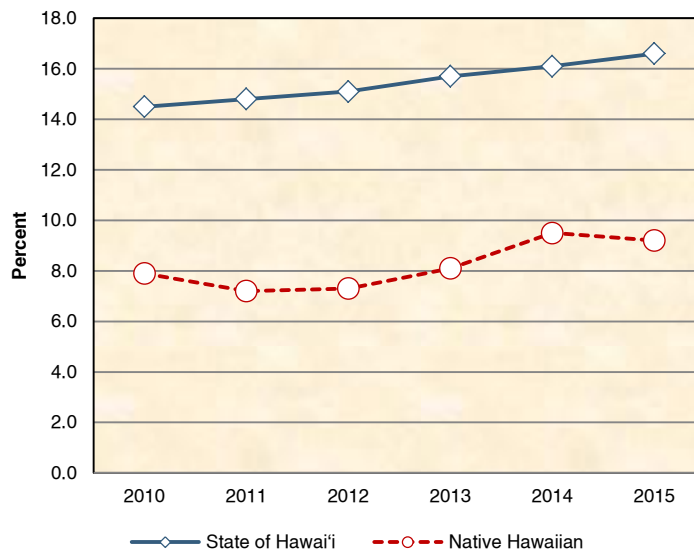

ABOUT THE DATA

Source: American Community Survey (ACS) is an ongoing statistical survey conducted by the US Census Bureau. It regularly gathers information previously contained only in the long form of the decennial census, thus filling a vital data gap. The data collected is based on a random sample and is subject to sampling variability.

Note: The concept of race as used by the Census Bureau reflects self-identification; it does not denote any clear-cut scientific definition of biological stock. The data for race represent self-identification by people according to the race which they most closely identify.

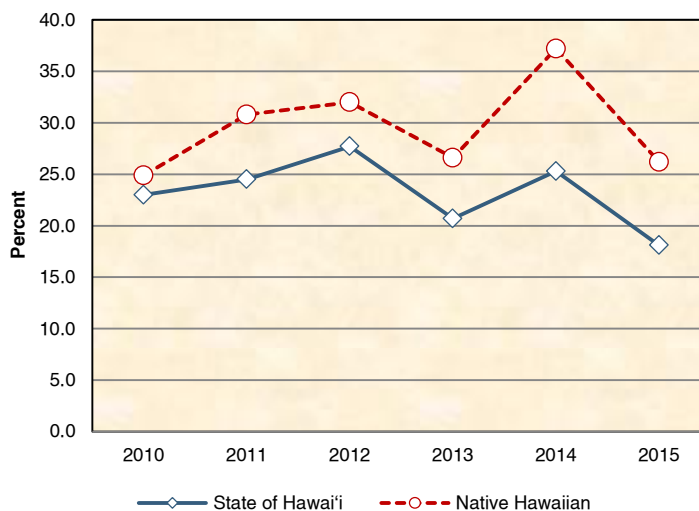

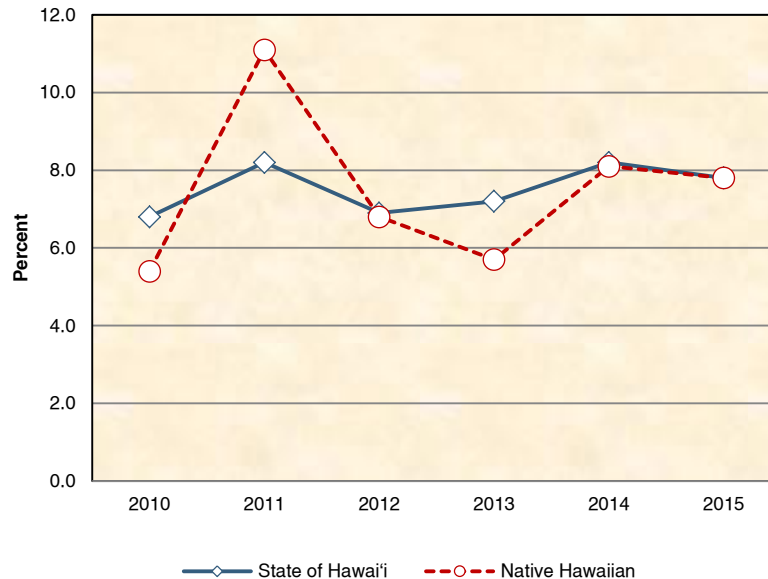

Poverty Rates for People 65 Years and Over in Hawai'i: 2010-2015



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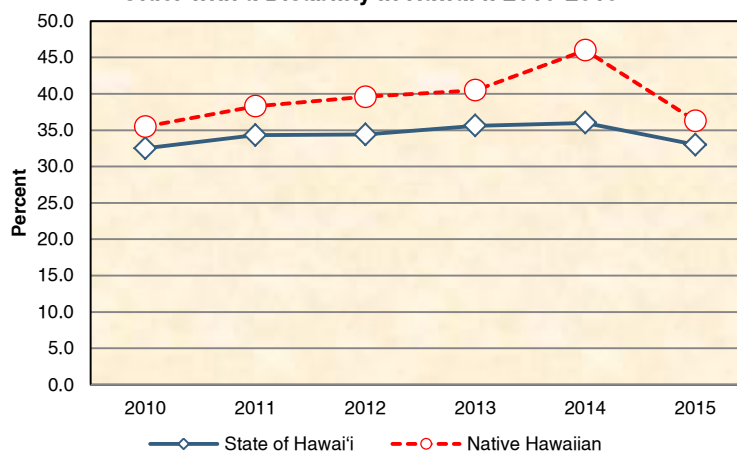

If the total income for a family or unrelated individual falls below the relevant poverty threshold, then the family or unrelated individual is classified as being "below the poverty level."

This condition can make it difficult for a person to do activities such as walking, climbing stairs, dressing, bathing, learning, or remembering. This condition can also impede a person from being able to go outside the home alone or to work at a job or business.
