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Medicaid is a jointly funded, Federal-State health insurance program for low-income and needy people. It covers children, the aged, blind, and/or disabled and other people who are eligible to receive federally assisted income maintenance payments.

The official name for "Obama Care" is the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), or Affordable Care Act (ACA) for short. The ACA was signed into law to reform the health care industry by President Barack Obama on March 23, 2010 and upheld by the Supreme Court on June 28, 2012.

A centerpiece of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, often referred to as "Obamacare", is the expansion of Medicaid eligibility to people with annual incomes below 138 percent of the federal poverty level, or \$26,347 for a family of three and \$15,417 for an individual.
