<sup>1</sup> During the intake process, individuals are asked to list a primary ethnicity. In this report, ethnic groups with few respondents were combined as follows: (a) "Other Pacific Islander" includes Samoan, Tongan, Guamanian/Chamorro, and other Pacific Islanders not listed individually; and (b) "Other Asian" includes Japanese, Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, Asian Indian, and other Asians not listed individually.

The Shelter Program data represent an unduplicated count of individuals who received homeless services at an emergency or transitional shelter from July 1, 2011–June 30, 2012.
