Graduation On-Time: Percent of high school students who complete high school within four years of their 9th grade entry date. Note. Hawaii’s current target is 80%.

Others: percent of high school completers who received a special education certificate of completion in lieu of a diploma and students who have been attending school but did not graduate in the four-year time frame
