- University of Hawai'i (UH), Hawai'i Community College: Hawai'i Technical College Renamed University of Hawai'i, Hawai'i Community College in 1970, Was Part of University of Hawai'i (UH), Hilo; Separated from University of Hawai'i, Hilo in 1991.
- University of Hawai'i (UH), Honolulu Community College: Honolulu Technical School Renamed University of Hawai'i, Honolulu Community College in 1966.
- University of Hawai'i (UH), Kapi'olani Community College: Kapi'olani Technical School Renamed University of Hawai'i Kapi'olani Community College in 1966.
- University of Hawai'i (UH), Kaua'i Community College: Kaua'i Technical School Renamed University of Hawai'i, Kaua'i Community College in 1965.
- University of Hawai'i (UH), Maui Community College: Maui Technical School Renamed University of Hawai'i, Maui Community College in 1966; Became 4 Year Institution in 2009; Renamed University of Hawai'i, Maui College in 2010.

Modern Language Association: Language Enrollment Database, 1958–2013

The Language Enrollment Database offers access to enrollments in languages other than English from the twenty-two surveys conducted by the Modern Language Association (MLA) between 1958 and 2009 and funded by the United States Department of Education.

Enrollment numbers are entered as reported to us by directors of institutional research or registrars. Users should note that the MLA surveys count course enrollments, not students. A student may be enrolled in more than one language course. A graduate student enrolled in an undergraduate course is counted as an undergraduate enrollment.
